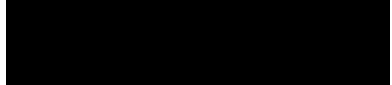

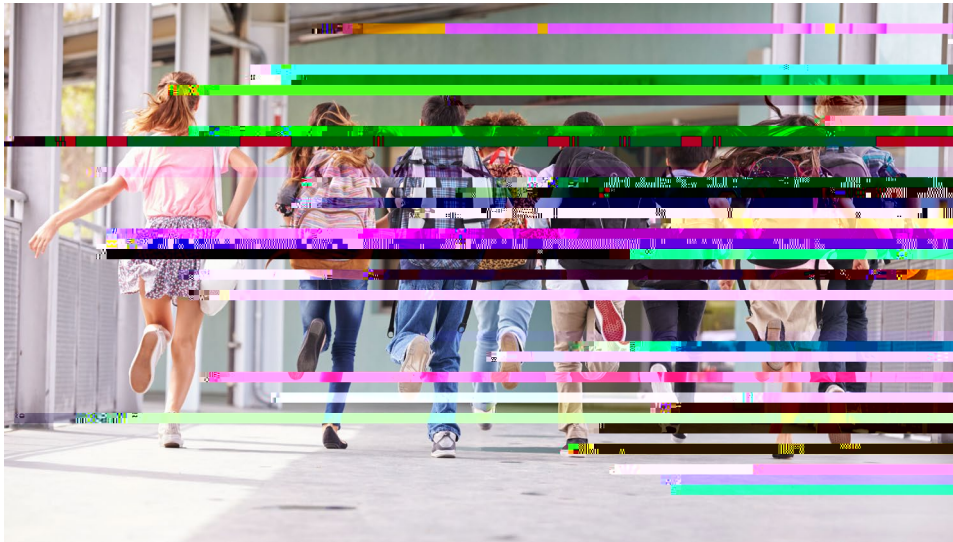

# Student and Family Affordability Fund

The Province is replenishing funding that helps families who need it most to cover the extra costs of school activities or buying school supplies for their children.

The Student and Family Affordability Fund will add an additional \$20 million from the Province to help schools provide support directly to families within their school communities.

Our allocation for 2024/25 is **\$740,000**.





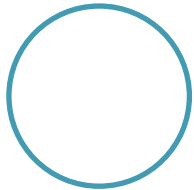
# Food Security

This fund no longer provides support for food security, as this responsibility has shifted to the newly established Feeding Futures Fund.

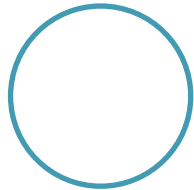




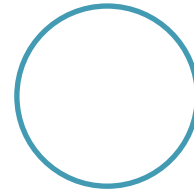
# Local Process



District staff has completed a process of how to distribute funds to schools.



School-based Admin will determine how school allocation will be distributed, and which families will need the support (e.g., school supplies, fieldtrips, fees etc.)



Schools will keep track of how money is spent because the District will need to meet reporting requirements as outlined by the Ministry of Education and Child Care.
